Securit Program

Program Description	The Securit Program provides participants with the essential skills needed for today's workplace. The program is designed to teach the nine essential skills as defined by Service Canada and viewed from the employer's point of view. It includes a three-week skills training component based on the individual specific employment needs of the client.
Certifications	Securit Certificate (CVTC), 3-month gym membership, STOC certifications (as needed).
Learning Objectives	By the end of the program the participant should be able to work in any organization that may have a need for a security employee. Training includes physical, emotional, and mental skills, and the outcome is based on personal goals and/or employment focus.
Eligibility Criteria	Living in British Columbia, not in a simultaneous Government funded program, unemployed or precariously employed, multi-barriered (i.e., housing instability, mental health challenges, lack of employment skills, limited literacy, older worker, a person with disabilities, etc.)
Program Hours	Classes are scheduled for a mandatory 6 hours per day, four days a week. Classes will be scheduled from Tuesday – to Friday, from 9:00 – to 3:30 daily, with additional time on Mondays for labs, testing and appointments.
Supports	Depending on need, support could include attendance support, living support, relocation assistance, wage subsidies, scholarships, completion rewards, travel, or other supports needed to complete the program. As this is an employment program, much of the support is based on an individual's need, once the participant is employed or furthering their education.
Evaluation	Participants will be evaluated through participation, attendance, and attitude throughout the program, as well as securing employment upon completion of the program.
Practicum	As part of the Securit Program, participants may be required to complete a two-week work experience/job shadow. The total program length is up to 12 weeks, dependent upon need.
